ASCEPT Garth McQueen Prize (oral prize)

Details of award	The ASCEPT Garth McQueen Prize was established in memory of Professor Garth McQueen, a member of the original steering committee that established ASCEPT and is awarded annually for the best oral communication by a Higher Degree student member of ASCEPT.
	Students who are shortlisted for the ASCEPT Garth McQueen Prize may still present their abstract in poster format so that they remain in contention for the poster prizes. Students who are not shortlisted will automatically be included in the poster program and are thus eligible for the poster prizes.
Eligibility criteria	 Financial member of ASCEPT. Current Higher Degree student includes anyone undertaking a Master's degree or PhD in a relevant biomedical discipline or Advanced Trainees in Clinical Pharmacology. Past winners are not eligible to apply.
Application	Applicants must submit an abstract for the ASCEPT ASM and upload an extended project description and declaration in the ASM abstract submission portal by the specified deadline.
	 Extended project description (maximum 800 words) should include the following sections: Title of presentation (i.e. the same title that appears on the standard abstract) Authors (i.e. the same authors that appear on the standard abstract) Background and rationale Hypothesis / Aims Methodology Results (maximum 1 single panel figure or 1 table) Conclusions Statement of the scientific innovation and significance of the study Statement on the nominating student's specific role in the study Declaration (see below – not included in word count) References (not included in word count) The extended project description is to be prepared by the student applicant with minimal or no input from their supervisor or other authors on the abstract. As a general guide, 'minimal' input might reasonably involve minor corrections of a single draft of the document. Students are to type the following declaration at the end of
